

DONCASTER OMNIBUS & LIGHT RAILWAY SOCIETY

The Doncaster Omnibus and Light Railway Society was formed in 1958 by a group of local transport enthusiasts who would regularly congregate for trips to locomotive and bus depots and for slide shows at member's homes. The potential of this informal group was recognised in 1963 when Doncaster Corporation's Transport Department entrusted the town's "last trolleybus", No. 375 to the society's care. Since then four Doncaster motorbuses have also been donated to us from the local transport authority, and a fifth by one of our members.

Shortly after receiving the trolleybus, the society became involved with the creation of the Sandtoft Transport Centre, which over the years has become an established working transport museum and renamed "The Trolleybus Museum at Sandtoft". This project and also the restoration and preservation of our vehicles are now the primary concerns of the society.

Regular social meetings for discussions and slide/digital shows are still held once a month, normally on the second Monday of the month at the Park Social Club, Eden Park Drive, Edenthorpe, Doncaster, commencing at 7.30pm.

During the summer months we occasionally attend historic vehicle rallies with one or more of our buses. We also organise the hugely successful Isle of Axholme Running Day & Rally each year at The Trolleybus Museum at Sandtoft.

Outings to places of transport interest are arranged from time to time and details of these and all our activities are circulated to members in our quarterly newsletter "Fleetlines".

As times, dates or venues for any of our meetings or events may be subject to change at short notice, we encourage members to provide an email address so that we can keep everyone informed.

All our preserved buses were once part of the Doncaster Corporation Transport fleet.

MDT 222

AEC Regal 3 with Roe 45 seat bodywork. One of three bought in 1953 to operate on the Sheffield service. In 1958 they were all converted for one man operation. In later life, 22 continued to operate on town routes whilst its sisters were transferred to the Civic Welfare Dept. 22 retired from service in 1972.

433 MDT

Leyland PSUC1/11 with Roe 45 seat bodywork. A very rare Tiger Cub variant which was new in 1963. It passed into SYPTE ownership in 1974, becoming number 1033 and was the only one of a five vehicle batch to do so, and the only one to remain unaltered. It was never painted in PTE colours.

94



EDT 703

1947 Leyland Titan PD2. When new, 94 was fitted with bodywork by Leyland, but in 1963 it was rebodied with its current Roe body which was built in 1955 and was originally fitted on one of the town's former trolleybuses. 94 was withdrawn from service in 1973, becoming part of the DOLRS collection two years later

GDT 421

1949 Daimler CVD6 with Roe low height bodywork for working under a low bridge on the Edlington route. It only spent 8 years with Doncaster Corporation before being sold to local bus operator Rossie Motors who ran it for a further 14 years. In private hands for a number of years, it passed to DOLRS in 1987

206



KDT 206D

Daimler CVG6 with Roe 62 seat front entrance bodywork. When new, these buses were fitted out for one man operation but were never used as such. 206 survived into SYPTE ownership, becoming no.1206 and was painted in their coffee and cream colour scheme.

375



CDT 636

375 was Doncaster's last Trolleybus when it operated the 7.30pm departure to Beckett Road on 14th December 1963. It is a Karrier Sunbeam W built in 1945 with utility bodywork by Brush. It was rebodied by Roe in 1955 with its current 62 seat body. 375 has recently undergone a major restoration and is now in regular service carrying passengers at the Sandtoft Trolleybus Museum
